At "The Peace," worshipers are invited to greet each other by saying, "The peace of Christ be with you," and responding, "And also with you."

After the first anthem children ages 4 - grade 1, are invited to Children's Church with Natalie Bishop held in the Children's Chapel in the Tinsley Stern building.

The first anthem, sung by the St. Andrews Choir, is an arrangement of an Advent hymn based on Isaiah 40:3-5 and Psalm 24:7-10. It has been used in the Church of Sweden for almost two hundred years. It is set to an older Swedish tune, which may have come from a German folktune that spread through Scandinavia. The arrangement is by American composer Mark Schweizer, who died on November 9, 2019.

The text of the second anthem is an adaptation of Revelation 22, written by the composer's wife. The piece was written while the composer's threeyear-old son John was in the hospital with double pneumonia, not expected to survive. He did recover and grew up to become a Lutheran pastor. The anthem was published and has been performed around the world.

Comfort, comfort you my people, tell of peace, thus says our God; comfort those who sit in darkness bowed beneath oppression's load. Speak you to Jerusalem of the peace that waits for them; tell them that their sins I cover, and their warfare now is over.
